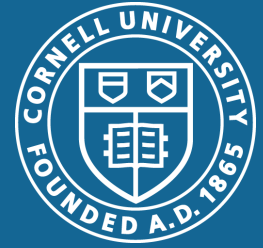


Special Workshop for Teachers
